Minutes of meeting of Natural Area Advisory Committee: 6 October 2009

Tuesday 4-5 PM, NATL pavilion. Members present were Doug Levey (chair), Tom Walker (administrative assistant), Francis Putz (incoming chair), Natalie Hooton (Graduate Assistant), Elizabeth Wells (Undergraduate Assistant), Susan Jacobson, Dan Fitzpatrick, Beverly Sensbach, Bret Pasch, Erick Smith, Eric Lewis, and Alex Cheesman

1. Introductions

The newest member of the NAAC, Dan Fitzpatrick (Entomology and Nematology Student Organization) was welcomed, as was Elizabeth Wells, the newly hired undergraduate assistant.

2. TA Report (Natalie Hooton)

Natalie reviewed the appended list of her activities over the summer of which the highlights (which engendered some discussion) were

- Developed and posted NATL dog policy
- General trail maintenance- trimming, mowing, trash pick-up, etc.
- Attended prescribed burn
- Helped finalize 9 fields in NATL master list of vascular plants
- Helped to plant 250 plugs of lopsided Indian grass in public area pine
- The development and placement of movable information signs along the trails that are intended to replace the printed trail guides (and have already done so along the SEEP trail). Remarkably, 22% of the plant species are illustrated and described on these signs (all accessible on the NATL website as well).
- She is working with owners of neighboring properties to urge them to control their invasive exotics.
- Worked with Dr. Weaver to identify plants new to NATL
- Organized small volunteer event to plant almost 350 plugs of wiregrass in south restricted area pine
- Carried out entire hiring process for undergraduate assistant

3. Actions Undertaken by the NATL Operations Committee (=TA + chair + administrative assistant)

- Simplified rules for using NATL: pre-approval needed by NAAC for "activities in restricted areas that last longer than one semester and that are evident in the absence of the user (e.g., flags and stakes marking plots or transects)."
- Posted additional NATL map that more clearly delineates Public and Restricted areas
- Purchased TrailMaster camera for recording usage of NATL

- Working to enhance the entrance to NATL from Cultural Plaza
- Updated and enhanced vascular plant list: <u>http://natl.ifas.ufl.edu/plants.htm</u>
- Completed controlled burns of upland pine (except part of south Restricted Area), planted plugs of wiregrass and lopsided Indian grass
- Academic guide to upland pine nature trail (to replace basic and advanced guides)
- Mapped and measured original pines in NATL-east

4. One Minigrant Discussed

A minigrant proposal on Cuban tree frogs was discussed and it was decided that while this version of the proposal should be rejected on scientific grounds (unanimous vote), the applicant will receive from the NATL Board a summary of the comments on the proposal so that it can be improved.

The committee agreed that there are advantages to "rolling deadlines" for Minigrant Proposals and will follow this procedure until it becomes problematic. For now the problem is too few applicants.

5. Soil Pit Update

Proponents of the plan to install one or more soil pits in the NATL were not represented at the meeting but have agreed that because of safety issues they only need to excavate down 4 feet. NATL has allocated \$500 for this project, but final plans for the pilot soil pit must be approved by the end of the Fall Semester 2009 or the funds will go back into the general NATL coffers. Faculty in the Soil and Water Science Department will be so notified.

6. Fiscal Affairs Discussed (Appendix A and B)

The fiscal results for 2008-2009 were reviewed and the proposed plan for 2009-2010 was discussed and approved unanimously.

7. Renaming the NATL Conservation Area

Doug reviewed the campaign that he has mounted to have the NATL Conservation Area named in honor of Tom Walker. He circulated a draft letter to the UF Administration, and will review the topic when he presents the NATL budget to the LVL Committee on Monday, 12 October. He also solicited letters of support from faculty; details will follow. The measure received unanimous and enthusiastic support.

8. Welcome to New NAAC Chair

Jack Putz was welcomed as the new NAAC Chair and a discussion ensued about the appointment of a vice chair. The general concerns are with continuity and sustainability of NATL leadership. One particular concern is that Jack plans to be off campus for 8 months next year, which makes the selection of a vice chair imperative.
