Last year's fiscal plan was approved by LVL (Lake, Vegetation and Landscaping Committee)

Spent \$548 more than budgeted

Every penny itemized, Tom has invoices

CITF funds -- \$200,615. An additional \$7,194.01 was spent by NAAC on nature trails.

This year – need fiscal plan approved by LVL

Expect to have \$9,000, but this could change if stock market declines.

Propose keep \$1,600 back for contingency fund.
