RULES FOR USING NATL

General

- •Activities should be in keeping with NATL's purpose—that is, to help students and the public learn about ecology and biotic diversity.
- •Activities should maintain, rather than significantly diminish, the usefulness of the area for its purpose.

Types of activities requiring approval

The following types of activities must be pre-approved by the Natural Area Advisory Committee:

- •Activities that permanently alter the ecology of the area.
- •Activities that may interfere with others using NATL.
- •Activities that may diminish the usefulness of NATL for teaching about ecology and biotic diversity.
- •Activities in the <u>restricted area</u> (NATL-west south of Division Trail and all of NATL-east; see map) that are evident in the absence of the user (e.g., flags and stakes marking plots or transects). Flags, stakes, etc.

Flags, stakes, and equipment may be temporarily left in the <u>public area</u> (NATL-west north of Division Trail) without permission. However, unless they are dated and their source identified (e.g., class number), they will be removed without notice. *In any case, the person who leaves flags, stakes, and equipment should remove them as soon as their purpose is completed.*
