 - Growing 50+ plugs in Entomology greenhouse and planting in Upland Pine area
 - See Figure 5 for areas of ideal 2020 burn areas
 - Past burns
 - Area just burned in Jan. 2020 last burned in 2018
 - Save as many trees as possible, raking around trees
