Northern Mockingbird (*Mimus polyglottos*)



Identification:

- White wing patches
- o Log black and white tail feathers
- o Gray above
- o White below
- o Yellow eyes
- o Black legs
- Slender bill
- Cardinal size
- o Wing and tail feathers form white cross when flying

Song:

- o Varied, mimics other sounds and birds
- o 3 or more phrases repeated quickly
- o Repetition distinguishes mockingbird from original species

Habitat:

- Forest edges
- o Open habitat

Diet:

- o Insects
- Berries

Northern Cardinal (Cardinalis cardinalis)



Identification:

- Short very thick orange bill
- o Red prominent crest on head
- o Bright red color with black face and chin
- o Males are red
- Females are red and brown

Song:

- Song sounds like "pretty, pretty, pretty" or "cheer, cheer, cheer"
- o Loud, metallic chirp sound
- Very loud and territorial
- o Both sexes sing

Habitat:

- o Forest, backyards, parks, woodlots, dense shrubby areas
- o Forage on the ground but perch high to sing
- Nest in dense tangles of shrubs

Diet:

- Seeds and fruit
- Some insects
- Often found at bird feeders
